# JIWG Authority Chronology

- 2 Nov 2004. O-6 meeting between OSD-SCI, OSD-TP, DLA J37, Joint Staff/J4, Army G4, Navy N41, USTRANSCOM TCJ5/4-A
- Purpose: To identify a single DoD organization to facilitate and coordinate a joint package and modular container standards and policy implementation.
- Recommended: JIWG be designated as the single organization within DoD responsible for facilitating and coordinating DoD package and modular container standards and policy implementation. All packaging and modular container efforts must be approved by the JIWG prior to being forwarded to the Joint Capabilities Integration Development System (JCIDS) process for consideration.

# JIWG Authority Chronology

- 1 Feb 2005. Joint Staff/J4 Message (OSD directed) to USTRANSCOM TCJ5, “SUBJECT: DESIGNATION OF JOINT INTERMODAL AND MODULAR CONTAINER STANDARDS, SYSTEM DEVELOPMENT AND POLICY COORDINATION OVERSIGHT “
- Designates the Joint Intermodal Working group (JIWG) as lead organization with approval authority under the DPO for joint intermodal and modular container standards, system development and policy coordination.

# JIWG Authority Chronology

- 21 Mar 2005, Service Chiefs Memorandum, “Joint Common Packaging/Containerization”
- Recommended Commander, United States Transportation Command, as the Distribution Process Owner, coordinate and develop common joint packaging and containerization standards and that the already functioning Joint Intermodal Working Group serve as the action agency for this effort.
- Recommended that distribution needs be identified during material solution briefings in the Joint Capabilities Integration and Development System (JCIDS).

# JIWG Authority Chronology

- 3 Feb 2006. OSD-ATL Memorandum, “Joint Intermodal Modular Containers/Platforms”
- “Effective immediately, Military Departments and Defense Agencies will coordinate any new or emerging intermodal container/platform initiatives with the JIWG prior to submitting requirements to the Joint Capabilities Integration Development System process.”

# Terms and Definitions

- Need to standardize intermodal and containerization terms
  - MILVAN, SEAVAN, container, ISO container, intermodal container, etc.
- Need review DOD directives and regulations; DOD Dictionary; Joint Doctrine; Service Regulations, Manuals, etc. and ISO Pub 830 (Vocabulary) for intermodal and containerization terms
- Recommend small group (Services/USTRANSCOM) work offline via e-mail and telcons
  - Services provide compilation of terms and definitions from their doctrinal pubs, regulations, policy, instructions, etc
  - USTRANSCOM review Joint Pubs, ISO and Industry Terms
  - Group provide recommended consolidated list existing terms, new terms for adopting within the DOD, as well as, removal of outdated terms
- Report out next JIWG meeting, Spring 2012; JIWG vote; follow up with submission to JS J7 for updating JP 1-02
