Accomplishments



- Strategic Advances
 - OPCON of Army Intermodal and Distribution Platform Management Office (AIDPMO)
 - Detention and Related charges remain under \$1.5M
 - Purchased over 60K detention and leased containers
 - USC 05 includes cap on Detention in Exigency Areas
 - Training key units prior to entry into theater
 - Deployed Container Management Element in theater
- Improved Business Practices
 - Streamlined commercial carrier purchasing process
 - Meeting requirements with Leased containers
 - Monitoring of leased container process
 - Improved invoicing and payment process
 - Automated and improved Metrics



Accomplishments



- Operations in Theater
 - Continued improvement in monthly inventory %
 - Global Partnership in working issues
 - Container Management Conference
 - Use of alternate ports for sustainment and unit moves
 - Added transload sites for OIF
 - Reefer buyout plans in place
- Improved Service cooperation and coordination
 - Working closely with Army on USC 04 and other issues
 - One source leasing for Service ammunition shipments

- Leverage current Inventory Processes and asset visibility for conducting the 2008 DoD Inventory
- DoD 4500.9-R Defense Transportation Regulation
 - Update CM Chapter with new Org structure
 - Revise for contingency operations billing

- Joint Intermodal Platform Management System(USTCJ6)
 - Data Sharing between ACAMS/IBS-CMM
 - Worldwide implementation of IBS-CMM
 - Develop Joint Container Asset Management System (JCAMS)




6. Web based services and real time Metrics for the management and reporting of container activities worldwide
