**UNIFORM POLICY FOR UNITED STATES TRANSPORTATION
COMMAND (USTRANSCOM) MILITARY PERSONNEL**

REFERENCES: (a) USTRANSCOM Policy Directive 36-2, 1 April 2006, **hereby cancelled.**

(f) NAVPERS 15665-I, *US Navy Uniform Regulations.*

A. PURPOSE: Prescribes the duty uniform, by Service, for all military personnel assigned or attached to USTRANSCOM, Scott Air Force Base, Illinois.

B. APPLICABILITY: Applies to all military personnel assigned or attached to USTRANSCOM.

C. POLICY:

1. Military personnel will wear the applicable Service uniform as the uniform of the day (UOD) as prescribed in paragraphs 2.1.1. through 2.1.5.

2. Seasonal changes. Navy and Marine Corps summer and winter uniforms will be worn beginning on dates as directed by their respective regional headquarters. For the Navy, this will occur around the first Monday in April for summer uniforms and the first Monday in October for winter uniforms. For the Marine Corps, the summer season begins the duty day following the change to Daylight Savings Time and the winter season begins the duty day following the change from Daylight Savings Time. Manpower and Personnel Directorate (TCJ1) will coordinate with regional Service headquarters and publish exact dates throughout the year.

2.1. During normal operations Service uniform of the day (UOD) is designated as follows:

2.1.1. Army: Army Combat Uniform (ACU), or Flight Suit (aviators on flight status).

2.1.2. Marine Corps: Combat Utility Uniform (CUU) or flight suit (aviators). Flight Suits may be worn by aircrew members and individuals engaged in flight or flight-related duties during that work day.

2.1.3. Air Force: Battle Dress Uniform (BDU), Airman Battle Uniform (ABU), or flight suit (if authorized) with the exception of Monday, where all Air Force members are required to wear “Blues” in any service combination unless otherwise specified. The BDU will be phased out effective 1 Nov 2011.

2.1.4. Navy: Navy Working Uniform (NWU); Optional when appropriate: Officers and (E7-9) – Khakis. Enlisted (E1-6) – Service Uniform; Flight Suits may be worn by aircrew members and individuals engaged in flight or flight-related duties during that work day. This authorization does not include ground support, non-aircrew maintenance, or non-aircrew support personnel.

2.1.5. Coast Guard: Tropical Blue Uniform, Operational Dress Uniform (ODU), or Untucked Operational Dress Uniform (UODU).

2.2. Exemptions to the policy for Service UOD are indicated below:

2.2.1. The following members are exempt from the UOD policy: Elite Guard personnel, Color Guard personnel when performing duties, Defense Couriers when performing duties and otherwise authorized civilian clothing, USTRANSCOM conference participants and visiting conferees, members authorized maternity uniform wear, members with medical waivers, and members attending official functions or performing duty where participants are otherwise directed to wear a uniform other than the UOD.

2.2.2. Additionally, on days when late reporting or essential personnel manning is authorized due to inclement weather or emergency situations, wear of the Service Utility Uniform or equivalent Service Utility Uniform is authorized.

D. EFFECTIVE DATE AND IMPLEMENTATION: This policy directive is effective immediately.
