USTRANSCOM OFFICER TOUR EXTENSIONS

REFERENCE: USTRANSCOM/TCDC Memo, USTRANSCOM Officer Tour Extensions Policy Letter - INFORMATION MEMORANDUM, 31 May 1994, **hereby cancelled.**

A. PURPOSE: To establish command policy regarding length of tour for officers assigned to USTRANSCOM, Scott AFB, Illinois.

B. APPLICABILITY: This policy directive applies to all officers in Joint Duty Assignment List (JDAL) billets, regardless of Service, assigned to USTRANSCOM, Scott AFB, Illinois.

C. POLICY:

- 1.** In support of the Services' need to meet joint duty assignment requirements for their officers, extensions will not normally be approved beyond their established tour dates.
- 2.** Requests for retirement beyond established tour dates will normally not be approved.
- 3.** Exceptions, if necessary, will require Directorate-level justification, staffed through the Directorate of Manpower and Personnel (TCJ1) with final approval/disapproval by the Deputy Commander in Chief (DCINC). TCJ1 will be the USTRANSCOM releasing authority for all extension requests after receipt of DCINC concurrence.

D. EFFECTIVE DATE: This policy directive is effective immediately.
